Cassandra Flora Averell – Cassandra is a graduate of Howland H.S. (Warren, OH), where she was Valedictorian of her Class; she was also elected to the National Society of H. S. Scholars included in Who's Who Among H.S. Students and was a National Merit Qualifier as well as a recipient of the U.S. Marines Musicianship Award. She has begun her studies at Baldwin Wallace College's Conservatory of Music (Berea, OH), where she has achieved a GPA of 3.982 in their Honors Program.



Michael Hopponen Bostanzoglou – Michael is a graduate of Lyman H.S. (Longwood, FL), where his musical talent was first discovered. He then overcame serious family and medical challenges to dramatically improve his GPA in his Junior and Senior years, working towards the goal of continuing his education in music. With the continued support of his mother and teachers, he applied to several colleges, and was asked to audition by the Alma Mater of giants in American music, including Quincy Jones, Branford Marsalis and Melissa Etheridge: the Berklee College of Music in Boston, where he is thriving.



Andreas Diamantis – Andreas graduated with honors from high school in Athens, Greece where he was born, but is pursuing a career in aviation here in the U.S. and is enrolled in the Bachelor's Degree Program in Aeronautics from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in Daytona Beach. According to his professors, Andreas' aptitude and passion for flying are matched only by his dedication to his studies: he has already been named to the University's Honor Roll twice, and has recently made the Dean's List as well.



Nicoletta Marie Drilias –Nicoletta Marie graduated first in her Class at Wauwatosa East High School (near Milwaukee, WI) and was Valedictorian at her graduation exercises. While maintaining a perfect four-year "A"-average in courses that included Advanced Placement Calculus, Biology and Chemistry, she also excelled in athletics, and was named a "Scholar-Athlete" on four occasions. Nicoletta Marie is attending the University of Wisconsin at Madison and is considering a career in Pharmacy.



Ioanna Georgopoulos – Ioanna graduated 7th in her Class of 513 at Glenbrook North H.S. 

U.S. Senator

PAUL S. SARBANES

of Maryland



Paul Spyros Sarbanes, Maryland's Democratic senior Senator, made Maryland history in November, 2000 by winning reelection to an unprecedented 5th term to the United States Senate, becoming the State's longest serving United States Senator. Sarbanes has been working for the people of Maryland for more than three decades, first as a member of the Maryland House of Delegates and then serving as a Congressman from the Third Congressional District for three terms. Since 1977, he has served with integrity and distinction in the United States Senate where he serves as the Ranking Member of the Senate Banking, Housing and Urban Affairs Committee, and is a senior member of the Foreign Relations, Budget and Joint Economic Committees.

"The Public Company Accounting Reform and Investor Protection Act" was signed into law on July 30, 2002, and has been referred to as "the most far-reaching reforms of American business practices since the time of Franklin Delano Roosevelt." The law is now known as the "Sarbanes-Oxley Act," named for the principal sponsors of the legislation.

Paul Sarbanes was born on Maryland's Eastern Shore on February 3, 1933. He was the son of Greek immigrants from Laconia, Greece -- Spyros (deceased 1957) and Matina Sarbanes (deceased 2001). The principles Senator Sarbanes learned growing up and that have guided his public life are opportunity and fairness -- principles that he strongly believes are fundamental to a decent and just society.

Sarbanes learned from his parents early in life how privileged we are to live in a democracy, the importance of community participation and, in particular, the importance of exercising the right to vote. In his many conversations with students across the State of Maryland, when he speaks of his passion for public service, Sarbanes talks about the high premium placed on involvement in public life by the ancient Greeks. In Athens, he says, "those who lived only in private life were falling short. They were called 'idiotes,' from which our word 'idiot' is derived today. Sarbanes and his wife Christine are the parents of three children and the grandparents of six. Sarbanes is a member of the Greek Orthodox Cathedral of the Annunciation in Baltimore.



U.S. Representative

MICHAEL BILIRAKIS

of Florida

It's not surprising that National Journal's *Almanac of American Politics* has called Rep. Mike Bilirakis one of the most "legislatively productive" members of Congress. He was first elected to Congress as Republican Congressman from Tarpon Springs in Florida's Ninth District on Nov. 2, 1982, and has been reelected to each succeeding Congress. His committee assignments in the 109th Congress include membership on the Energy and Commerce Committee, where he serves as Vice-Chairman of the full Committee and a member of both the Health, Telecommunications and the Internet, and Energy and Air Quality Subcommittees. Mike is also the Vice-Chairman of the Veterans' Affairs Committee and Chairman of the Oversight Subcommittee.

For 10 years, Mike served as the Chairman of the Health Subcommittee, which has jurisdiction over much of the health-related legislation introduced in the House of Representatives. As Subcommittee Chairman and now as Vice-Chairman of the full Committee, Mike is a vocal advocate for medical research and a national leader on health reform. He was also instrumental in the passage of the Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement, and Modernization Act of 2003.

Mike's strong values will continue to guide him as he works to improve the health and quality of life of all Americans. As Vice-Chairman of the full Energy and Commerce Committee, Mike will continue to play a major role in crafting national health policy. In recognition of his efforts on behalf of veterans, Mike has received many national awards, including the VFW's Congressional Award for his outstanding service to the Nation's veterans.

In the past, Mike has served as Chairman of the Task Force on the Elderly and has been a leader in the fight against infant mortality. He has also held memberships on the Congressional Human Rights Caucus, the Immigration Reform Caucus and the Congressional Task Force on POW/MIAs. He is a co-founder of both the Military Veterans Caucus and the Congressional Caucus on Hellenic Issues, which has taken gone far in educating its colleagues on matters of importance to our community: the rights of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, the thirty-year occupation of Cyprus by Turkish troops, and the usurpation of the name "Macedonia" by a former Yugoslav Republic.

"The Voice of Greece"

For over twenty-five years, Glykeria has been a force on the Greek music scene, both at home in Greece and throughout the world. With over 30 Gold and Platinum albums to her credit and her participation in hundreds of compilations, she is—by far—one of Greece's most prolific and popular female voices of all time.

The New York Times called her "legendary," and The Boston Globe called her "the wonder of Greece," following a sold-out tour of North America in 2001.

In 2005, she was invited by Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew to perform at the annual "Sunday of Orthodoxy" Concert in Istanbul and perform at the Bursa International Culture Festival-- the largest musical festival in Europe with over 400,000 participants.
