Hellenic Birthright 2013 Report Twenty Sponsored Students say "Thank You"

From June 17 through July 22, 2013, the PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation was proud to offer for a second consecutive year its **Hellenic Birthright** program—a five-week educational and cultural enrichment experience for Greek American college students who have never been to Greece. The Foundation was able to send twenty students to Greece for a total cost of \$100,000 in order

to exercise their birth-given right to personally connect with the land of their ancestors and thus experience the magnificence of Greece. This would not have been possible without the generous support of our Community and faithful donors.

Hellenic Birthright was again offered in collaboration with our partners at Anatolia College and their School of Higher Studies, The American College of Thessaloniki. The twenty lucky applicants who were selected from across the United States not only experienced the trip of a lifetime, but created

memories and friendships which they will cherish forever. In addition to visiting countless cities and archaeological sites across 2 continents, the students also received up to 4 transferable college credits through two courses, which included "The World of Alexander The Great" and an "Art History Museum Practicum." The classes were taught by highly qualified faculty on the beautiful Anatolia College campus in Thessaloniki.

For many of our sponsored students, it was the very first time they had ever left the United States and traveled so far away from "home." However, as they returned to the States following the completion of the

program, one by one, it was apparent that they now considered Greece their newly discovered "home." This is exactly why the PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation and its Chairman, Chris P. Tomaras, wanted to create a program which gave Greek Americans the opportunity to visit their ancestral homeland and appreciate and absorb first hand all that Greece has to offer.

The 2013 Hellenic Birthright itinerary included Thessaloniki, Pella, Vergina, Delphi, Athens, Thebes, Dion, Olynthos, and Philippi, among many others. However, the most memorable highlight was the trip to Constantinople and a private meeting with His All Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew. Carlyn Loutos, a Broadcast Journalism major at the University of Central Florida, said "Meeting His All Holiness Patriarch Bartholomew was an experience I will never forget. It was so humbling being able to stand in his presence. What an absolutely incredible and inspiring human being. It made me so grateful for the religion and culture that I am blessed to have and know."


Another highlight of the trip was an impromptu Greek dancing lesson in Thessaloniki—a first for many of our Hellenic Birthright participants. The lesson was a special treat from the staff at Greece's Artion Magazine, who interviewed all twenty of our participants on the topic of what it was like growing up Greek in America, and how this oncein-a-lifetime trip has affected them. Bristol, a Sophomore at Emerson College majoring in Screenwriting, describes how he felt dancing with an authentic Greek dance troupe, "I Greek-danced for the first time in my life this past week. The most memorable moments I have had in Greece have occurred whenever I truly immersed myself in the culture."

Above all, our participants learned the true meaning of Greek φιλότιμο through their experiences and daily interactions. One such interaction was when one of our participants required emergency dental care due to an old accident. The dentist who assisted

the student in Thessaloniki did so absolutely free of charge—he refused to accept any money. Although Greece is going through a very public economic crisis, this story serves as a tribute to the endurance of the Greek spirit, and the kindness of the Greek heart.

The 2013/2014 Scholarship Application is Now Available The Foundation Will Again Award \$250,000

The PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation is proud to announce that its 2013/14 application is now available for eligible Greek American college students who meet the qualifying criteria. Since its establishment, the Foundation has awarded over 200 Greek American students with \$1.7 million through our Scholarship Awards and the Hellenic Birthright program.

The Foundation will again award \$250,000 in scholarships that will be distributed at our Awards Gala taking place at the Hilton Chicago on Saturday, June 14, 2014.



The PanHellenic Awards are available at two levels:

- Twenty (20) Awards of \$10,000 based on academic achievement and financial need.
- Twenty (20) Awards of \$2,500 based solely on academic achievement.

The \$250,000 in scholarships is the largest amount awarded to Greek American students by any organization in the United States. Founded in 1998 by Chris P. Tomaras, the Foundation's goal is to build a better America through Education and Hellenism. "I believe that by providing scholarships and educational programs to Greek American students who have the potential to be life-long achievers, we can strengthen our civic fabric in America and deliver enlightened and engaged citizens. Over 10 million students in the US applied for financial aid in 2012 in order to pay their college tuition. I want to make sure that the best and brightest of our Community have the resources they need to complete their education," said Tomaras.

Students from all fifty states are encouraged to apply, and applications should be postmarked by Friday, January 31, 2014.

"I felt incredibly honored to receive such a prestigious award and be amongst some of the most talented and intelligent Greek Americans from across the nation. It is very heartwarming to know that an organization such as the PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation exists, and cannot express enough thanks for the monetary assistance they have provided me and countless others in supporting us through our education. I plan to always live up to the expectations set forth by the organization and hope that when my studies conclude that I too will be able to support the next generation of Greek Americans to pursue their own dreams through education and Hellenism."
